In 1960 Captain Joseph Kittinger set the record at the time of the highest balloon ascent, highest parachute jump (102,800 feet), longest drogue fall and fastest speed by a human through the atmosphere (614 mph). One of the Parachute Museum's most popular exhibits, designed to

Huffman Prairie Flying Field Interpretive Center is Open

Wednesday through Sunday from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM

The Huffman Prairie Flying Field Interpretive Center building has re-opened as of May 12, 2021. Like the Wright Dunbar/Aviation Trail Visitor Center, which reopened on April 21, it is operating under modified days and hours. It is open to the public Wednesday through Sunday from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM. (The outdoor spaces, at the Huffman Prairie Flying Field, and the Wright Brothers Memorial, have remained open to the public). The park phone number is (937) 225-7705.

The Interpretive Center's exhibits focus on the Wright brothers' experimental flights at Huffman Prairie Flying Field in 1904 and 1905, and on The Wright Company's flying school at Huffman Prairie from 1910 to 1916. The Interpretive Center also covers the history of Wright-Patterson Air Force Base from its beginnings at McCook Field in Dayton during World War I, up to its contributions to the aerospace projects of the future. (Site #3b on the Aviation Trail).

The memorial is located at the top of Wright Brothers Hill, overlooking the Huffman Prairie Flying Field where Wilbur and Orville conducted tests of their early flying machines in 1904 and 1905 and where the Wright School of Aviation operated a flying school from 1910 to 1916. A plaque on the stone wall surrounding the plaza around the Memorial lists the names of the 119 pilots trained at Huffman Prairie. (Site #3a on the Aviation Trail).

After their historic first flights at Kitty Hawk, North Carolina, on December 17, 1903, the Wright brothers continued the development of their invention at Huffman Prairie field in 1904 and 1905. Later, the Wright Company operated a flying school at Huffman Prairie from 1910 to 1916. Today, the field remains much as it was when Wilbur and Orville Wright flew their experimental airplanes over Torrence Huffman's pasture. (Site #3c on the Aviation Trail).

The North American B-25 Mitchell was an American twin-engine medium bomber manufactured by North American Aviation. Allied air forces flew it in every theater of World war II, and it was used my many other air forces after the war, seeing service across four decades.

- Built in 1944 by North American, our B-25J served with the USAAF for 13 years. It was used as a trainer, transport and personnel transport. In 1957 it was transferred to the famous "airplane boneyard" at Davis-Monthan AFB where it was stored until ~1959 when it was bought by a private company and fought fires in Canada and the USA. It continued to be used as an airtanker until the late 1980's when it was restored to its wartime specifications.
- In 2008 the Champaign Aviation Museum acquired the aircraft and has been flying and meticulously maintaining it ever since. We regularly fly the B-25 to airshows, events, warbird ride experiences, and for flyovers.
