National Aviation Day was established as a national observation by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1939 to celebrate the development of aviation. The date of August 19 was designated in honor of Orville Wright's birthday (August 19, 1871 - which is also the birthday of sister Katherine Wright in 1874). The day is usually the occasion of events and activities that promote interest in aviation. With the current pandemic precaution in 2020, public celebrations may be limited, but there are still some museums open for visiting (with the usual precautions) - CLICK HERE to check the blog post about the current status of museums and attractions on the Aviation Trail.
